Water on Your Day

Between triple-digit heat and scant rainfall, the dog days of summer have arrived with a vengeance — along with landscape watering restrictions for the first time since 2018.

That means watering your lawn with an irrigation system, sprinkler or soaker hose is allowed only **one day a week** on your designated watering day, determined by the last number of your street address.

Watering hours on your day are also limited:

STAGE 1 – before 11 a.m. or after 7 p.m. STAGE 2 – 7-11 a.m. or 7-11 p.m.

Watering days begin and end at midnight, so no overnight watering is allowed. But you can hand-water with a hose-end nozzle, drip irrigation or bucket any day and time.

To find out the current stage, tune in to your favorite local TV weather forecast or visit **saws.org/WhenToWater**.

Did you know that one deep, weekly watering is actually better for your lawn than watering less over multiple days? So you can keep your landscape healthy *and* save on your water bill.

Here's a tip: Set your irrigation controller to Stage 2 watering times now. By watering during mostly daylight hours, you can keep an eye out for broken sprinkler heads before they cause a big jump in your water bill.

New Pipeline Primed and Pumping

In a little more than two years, SAWS' ambitious Central Water Integration Pipeline project went from drawing board to drinking water delivery.

The valves were opened July 3, marking completion of the conduit that connects SAWS' new Vista Ridge water supply to central San Antonio. The effort included four

miles of new water mains, two miles of tunnels and major upgrades at two pump stations.

With completion of the pipeline, the recently opened Agua Vista Station is expected to ramp up to full capacity, delivering more than 48 million gallons per day of Vista Ridge water by September.
