# SAWS Water, Sewer Rates To Remain Steady in 2021

The coronavirus pandemic has taken a toll on many families' finances. But human health and safety, as well as access to affordable water, will remain top priorities for San Antonio Water System in the coming year, as the COVID-19 crisis lingers on.

For the first time in more than a decade, there will be no customer rate increase for water or sewer service in 2021. The SAWS Board of Trustees approved the utility's \$909 million budget during its November meeting.

In addition to keeping water and sewer rates unchanged, the budget allows for continued work on infrastructure improvements communitywide. This includes ongoing efforts to upgrade the city's sewers under an agreement with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

Another highlight of the 2021 budget is increased funding for customer payment assistance programs. The SAWS Affordability Discount reduces bills for those who qualify based on their household income.

## **Boring Time at the Ballpark**

"This is the one budget I am OK with exceeding each and every year if we can find additional eligible participants," said Doug Evanson, senior vice president & chief financial officer. "Obviously with the impacts of COVID-19, we know there are more people we may be able to help."

Despite reduced revenue during the pandemic, there are no planned layoffs or furloughs for SAWS employees, thanks to the utility's strong financial planning. However, there will also be no performance-based pay raises for employees in 2021.

After 13 years, it's finally time to play ball. A massive tunnel boring machine was lowered deep into the abyss near Wolff Municipal Stadium — home of the San Antonio Missions baseball team — Nov. 11 on the city's Southwest Side. The sewer main replacement along U.S. Highway 90 and SW Military Drive near Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland involves five miles of tunneling more than 100 feet below ground, to avoid disrupting traffic and military activity. The much-needed infrastructure project, in the planning stages since 2007, will cost up to \$210 million and serve more than 500,000 San Antonians. SAWS officials say it's the most costly, complex sewer pipeline project in the city's history. Construction is expected to be completed in 2023.

### Too Much Water Makes Winter Weeds Go Wild

In winter, landscape plants are not actively growing. Winter weeds, however, are busy multiplying with every drop of water they get.

As long as soil temperatures are below 70 degrees, turf grasses will not produce green shoots. What will turn green are germinating winter weeds like dandelions and henbit, along with all kinds of weedy grasses.

Your best defense against winter weeds? Frequent mowing or pulling. This keeps them from flowering and going to seed. So-called "weed and feed" products are *not* a good remedy — they only help the weeds grow.

Remember: Your lawn only needs about 1/2-inch of water per month in winter — even less if it rains. Shrubs and trees usually do fine on rainfall alone. But if you do need to water them, use a hand-held hose to target individual plants.
