- I. Meeting called to order at 11:34 am by DRC Chair Dr. Jeremy Roberts.
- II. No public comments.
- III. Sean McConnell moved to approve the minutes, and the motion was seconded by Golda Obinzu. The minutes were approved unanimously.
- IV. Announcements
  - The next quarterly meeting is September 17, 2025.
- V. Dispute Program Update
  - Nathan provided a reminder about attendance and that more than two consecutive absences without notification could result in removal from the committee.
  - There have been 1,228 violations issued in 2025 with 62 L1, 127 L2, and 11 L3 dispute requests so far
  - Overall, there have been 4,483 violations since inception on 7/6/24 with 254 L1, 323 L2 and 20 L3.
  - Of the 323 L2 Disputes
    - i. 159 upheld (49.2%)
    - ii. 105 dismissed (32.5%)
    - iii. 52 under review (mostly private well exemption claims)

- Of the 20 L3 Disputes
  - i. 13 upheld
  - ii. 4 pending a panel hearing
  - iii. 2 dismissed
  - iv. 1 dropped by the customer prior to hearing
- Disputes since 2/13/25 meeting
  - i. 1,080 violations
  - ii. 43 L1
  - iii. 104 L2
    - 1. 61 upheld, 18 dismissed, 16 under review, 9 provided extended class deadline
  - iv. 9 L3
    - 1. 4 upheld, 4 awaiting a panel hearing, 1 dismissed
- Common dispute reasons
  - i. Broken controller, power outage affected controller schedule, Smart controller ran system on a different day due to rain/freezing temps, claiming private well exemption, wrong assigned address.

#### VI. Comments/Questions

- Mitchell S: are there lots of requests for leniency on first violations or concerns the non-compliance charge is too much?
  - i. Many first-time violators seem to gloss over the verbiage in their letter stating they can take the class to avoid the non-compliance charge. We are glad to issue short extensions to their class deadline.
- Sean: Would it be possible to provide more standardized info in the dispute packets?
  - i. Examples: controller information w/ photo, etc?
  - ii. Patrol staff are not authorized to enter private property, so photos of controllers are not usually possible.
- Golda: Cases are straightforward, and the packets are well prepared.
- Brice: The panels always seem to have excellent discussions about the cases and reach fair decisions.
- Jeremy: I have spoken to Gavino (Ramos) and Mr. Puente (CEO) on the progress of the DRC. They expressed pride on how well the work is going so far.
