SAWS' water portfolio includes 13 supply projects from seven different sources, including groundwater desalination and the country's largest underground water storage system.

Our new ConnectH2O electronic meters let customers view hourly water use, receive leak alerts, and manage their consumption to save water and money.

Along with world-class supply management and conservation, SAWS proactively detects leaks and replaces pipes to help ensure every drop produced gets delivered.

WASTEWATER RECYCLING

SAWS operates the nation's largest direct recycled water system, turning treated sewage into a renewable resource for irrigation, data centers, manufacturing and more.
