- Have the valve installed close to the meter where it will shut off water to the entire property.

- Make sure installation is done after March 16, 2022.
- Complete the shut-off valve rebate application at GardenStyleSA.com/valve.
- Submit the application with a photo of the new shut-off valve and a copy of the receipt. (Ask the plumber to note the type of service line pipe on your receipt).

Once all rebate requirements are met, a \$100 credit will be applied to the customer's water bill. The offer is limited to the first 2,000 qualified customers.

Please note that replacing existing shutoff valves does not qualify for this rebate.

Hold Off on Lawn Watering for Now

Get your spring lawn off to a healthy start

— let the hoses and sprinklers

collect a few more cobwebs.

Even though things are starting to green up, most turf grasses don't hit their growing season stride until April. If you start watering too early, the weeds will get a big boost but your lawn won't benefit much at all. With a few good spring showers, you might even push

back watering until Tax Day, April 18.

That's good news for your grass and your pocketbook. Since SAWS water rates are tiered, the more

you use the more it costs per gallon. That could cause a big jump in your bill if you water too much or too early. So keep that in mind when you set your sprinkler system.

It's Time To Prune Your Perennials

Much like overgrown hair in need of a haircut, perennials need a good spring cleaning in the way of pruning. When

done correctly, pruning increases foliage, flowers and pollinators.

Salvia and lantana should be cut to 3 inches above the ground,

the ground, while esperanza and Pride of Barbados can be left to 6 inches above the ground. Ornamental grasses like Lindheimer muhly and eastern gamagrass prefer just a trim.



Exceptions to the spring pruning rule include spring-blooming shrubs and trees such as Texas mountain laurel, Mexican plum, redbud and ornamental pear.

Wait until after the bloom to prune — generally in late April or May.
